Who is it for?

All Year 12 students who are strongly considering Physics at university.

What will we be doing?

We plan to meet regularly throughout the year, during which time we will:

- meet professional physicists
- attend seminars giving advice on universities and careers
- arrange Work Experience

What's in it for me, the teacher?
